An Art assessment morning will take place, consisting of an Art lesson and a short discussion with the Head of Art. Candidates should bring with them a small portfolio of work that they have enjoyed doing and will be happy to talk about.

Section C

Sport Scholarships

Candidates for a Year 12 Sport Scholarship should be able to demonstrate a high level of fitness and will be expected to participate in, and demonstrate their ability in, one of the core sports of the assessment day: netball, hockey, cricket (girls); rugby, football, cricket (boys). Swimming and athletics may also be considered.

Applications must contain:

- A personal statement written by the applicant outlining their suitability for a Sport Scholarship. This should include their previous and, more importantly, current involvement in sport including school or representative honours.
- One or more written recommendations to confirm the candidate's ability from at least one of the following: sports coach, PE/class teacher or county coach.

We shall hold an assessment day when candidates will be evaluated on their ability in their chosen sport(s), their fitness and motor co-ordination and on their potential to contribute fully to the school sports programme.

Candidates will be asked to arrive wearing appropriate clothing to participate in their practical activity and to bring with them water and any necessary medication. Parents will be sent further information by email very shortly before the assessment morning.
